

  - Massachusetts Boating certificate requirements goes into effect on 4/1/2026. Anyone born after 1/1/89 will be required to have a boating certificate. If you already have a certificate from any other state, you are exempt



# Massachusetts Boating Law Changes:

# THE HANSON MILONE ACT OF 2024

Massachusetts has passed new laws affecting recreational boating, known as the **Hanson Milone Act of 2024**. These changes are important for everyone who enjoys boating on our state's waters.

### ✓ Here are some key points to know:

#### 1. Mandatory Boating Safety Education

- Starting April 1, 2026, all motorboat operators born after January 1, 1989, must complete
  a boating safety course to operate motorized vessels or personal watercraft (like jet skis).
  Anyone born before January 1, 1989, will have until April 1, 2028, to obtain their boater
  safety certificate.
- The course can be taken online or in person and covers essential safety rules, boat operation, and how to avoid accidents.
- After completing the course, boaters will receive a boating safety certificate, which must be available for display while operating a boat.

#### 2. Age Requirements for Boating

- To operate motorboats, you must be at least 12 years old and hold a valid boater safety
  certificate unless accompanied on-board and directly supervised by a capable adult who is
  18 years of age or older with a valid boater safety certificate.
- Personal watercraft (PWC) users must be at least 16 years old with a valid boater safety certificate to operate, with no exceptions.

#### 3. Life Jacket Laws


- A throwable personal flotation device is designed to be thrown to someone in the water.

  This includes Type IV or Type V devices with Type IV performance. However, wearable PFDs are not considered throwable unless clearly marked as such.
- A wearable personal flotation device (PFD) is designed to be worn or attached to the body. This includes legacy Type I, II, III, or V PFDs with Type I, II, or III performance.
- Every vessel must have at least one wearable personal flotation device (PFD) for each person onboard. All PFDs must be U.S. Coast Guard approved, the right size for the user, and in good condition. Boats 16 feet or longer must also carry a throwable PFD (legacy Type IV).



#### Why is this Important?

The changes made by the **Hanson Milone Act** are designed to make boating safer for everyone. With more young people and families on the water, it's important that everyone knows the rules and understands how to stay safe. By following these new laws, you help keep our waters safe for all boaters!



○ Tim presented an interesting article on a 7# Large Mouth caught on Lake Champlain. They did testing on the fish and determined that it is between – 16-18 years old!



How old is this fish? 🧆

Collecting age data from fish populations is a routine part of the job for department fisheries biologists, but getting to handle a bass this big doesn't happen often! As luck would have it, when Vermont angler Roy Gangloff caught this 7 lb 13 oz Largemouth Bass in Lake Champlain this April, department biologist Shawn Good was on-hand and he snipped off a single dorsal fin spine before it was released. Back in the lab, the spine was cleaned, embedded in epoxy, and sliced paper-thin using a special saw. Under a microscope, slices from the spine reveal growth rings - just like a tree trunk. Each ring marks a year in the fish's life.

The verdict? At 22-inches and nearly 8 pounds, this bass was between 16 and 18 years old!

That's nearly two decades of growth - an impressive reminder of just how long it takes to reach trophy size in northern climate waters, where fish don't grow year-round. Aging studies like this help biologists understand fish growth rates, lifespan, and population health – key information that helps us manage Vermont's fish populations and provide outstanding fishing opportunities. Like this incredible bass!
